Purpose

Founded in 1988, Good Works Inc. is a faith-based nonprofit organization headquartered in Coatesville, PA. From our warehouse sites in Coatesville, Exton, Phoenixville and St. Peters Village, we now serve 49 municipalities in Chester County. We transform sub-standard houses into warmer, safer, drier homes, and despair into hope. Our services are offered to homeowners at no cost and volunteers do most of the repairs. Our goal is to see the inhabitants of these homes rise above their level of poverty and experience a richness through being cared for and knowing that their circumstances matter to their community and to God. We believe that everyone benefits when people from different races, cultures and backgrounds join together with a common purpose – repairing homes and restoring hope.

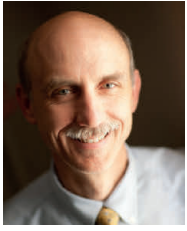

From the Executive Director



Never let a good crisis go to waste

After a punishing year in 2020 due to COVID, we all had high hopes for 2021. Unfortunately, 2021 introduced its own series of challenges including Omicron, sky-high building material prices and a not so friendly visit from Tropical Storm Ida. It was a daunting trifecta of circumstances, but you would not have known it from Good Works operations, ministry and financial standpoints. In spite of it all, over 1,000 volunteers faithfully served their “neighbors in need” by making critical home repairs that kept many from falling deeper into debt or even becoming homeless. Our staff found themselves operating like first responders in the face of Ida, pumping out flooded basements and restoring basic utilities for many of those whose properties were damaged by the flooding. But, Good Works’ impact in 2021 was so much more than a new roof or a dry basement. It was through the relationships that blossomed between those who served and those being served. God worked life-changing miracles filled with hope, joy and dignity.

It was Winston Churchill who said: “Never let a good crisis go to waste.” God can take impossible situations and turn them around for His glory. But it takes faith. We want our faith to grow in the sunshine and the good times, and it does to some degree. But, real faith grows when the storm clouds are forming, when the river is rising and there is nothing you can do about it. Why? Because that is when we hang on to God. During Tropical Storm Ida, many homeowners could do nothing more than go to the highest floor in their home and pray that the water would stop rising. As the water receded, the damage created by Ida became even more brutally evident. Ironically, it was also when the transformations began. Our staff and volunteers, along with others from local churches and community agencies began removing the damaged walls, doors, windows, wiring, plumbing, furniture and appliances along with wheel barrows full of muck. Good Works went on to provide life-transforming assistance to 17 low-income families over the next few months.

As you peruse this year’s Annual Report, consider that the transformations experienced were more than physical repairs to someone’s home. On a deeper level, our staff and volunteers brought emotional, relational and spiritual healing to homeowners, family members, volunteers and many others in the powerful name of Jesus Christ. I hope you are inspired.

It Happened so Fast...

No one could have imagined the devastation that Tropical Storm Ida would inflict on Coatesville, Downingtown and surrounding communities. The swollen Brandywine River crested on September 2, 2021 at 13 feet above flood stage, the highest in recorded history. Hundreds of homes and businesses were impacted. In the most extreme cases, water flooded both the basement and first floors of homes forcing families to evacuate and seek higher ground. "The water came up so fast" homeowner Irene recalled, "I had never seen anything like it." Basement appliances such as furnaces, water heaters, laundry equipment and electric utilities were destroyed. Inches of muck coated floors and belongings that weren't washed away were ruined. It was a monumental clean-up effort and Good Works staff and volunteers were there to help.

Restoring Hope

"I felt unlovable" Linda lamented. The Good Works volunteers had a big job on their hands, not only with the repairs to Linda's home, but helping Linda to rebuild her life. "The volunteers put up with me", she wrote, "they were a bright spot in my life on each workday. The best part of Good Works was when we gathered together to ask the Lord's blessing." While Linda's home was being restored, Good Works Ambassadors were dealing with her depression and over time she experienced a breakthrough with God restoring her spirit. "Good Works led me to Jesus Christ and I asked Him into my life. He has given me a joy I thought was impossible. I feel like a child again." "God loved me when I felt unlovable." The Bible tells us: Faith, hope and love...and the greatest of these is love!

"Good Works lifted my spirit and gave me hope, their kindness, generosity and love of God. I feel like I was reborn. It wasn't only the what, but the how. I was amazed at how caring the volunteers were and I was impressed with their skill and knowledge. They were very patient with me concerning the home improvements and decluttering my home, but there was more, I reconnected with God," Suzanne shared. "Learning about God again and reading my Bible has changed my quality of life. I pray more and try to live my life daily with God in it. And, now I am attending the church of the volunteers who worked on my home."

"I was paralyzed and could not even express it. It was as though a tragedy had struck my mind, heart and spirit. I was finding myself sinking deeper into despair. Then I had an epiphany! I began the morning of my March workday with fervent prayer. As I did, it was like this inner stream of joy flooded my being as I realized I was going out to do the duties God had called me to do. Nothing...absolutely NOTHING was going to steal the refreshing essence of my Lord and Savior's presence. The Son/sun shone 'round about me and His breath filled my lungs. I went from feeling 'terrible separation' to pure joy. This is a day I will remember and cherish."

"I asked both Ada and Tom why God should let them into heaven. Tom said he did not know. I asked if I could show him how he can know and he responded 'yes.' I shared a gospel track with him and started with Romans 10:9-10 and Ephesians 2:8-9. I used an example of offering him 1,000 dollars as a gift with no strings attached, but a choice needs to be made in order to accept it. God will not impose Himself on a person because He wants a mutual, loving, relationship. I asked Tom the 'Share Jesus Without Fear'

questions and he responded that he wanted Jesus to be the Savior of his life! Ada joined us in prayer as Tom prayed the prayer of salvation. Tom said he truly meant it and praise God his name is now written in the Lambs Book of life!"

"Hallelujah!!! Joan and I finally connected today and we shared a wonderful conversation. Although I wasn't there when Joan gave her life to Christ, I truly 'witnessed' a profound change today in her whole demeanor. I could even hear the difference in her voice...a mixture of joy and determination! Joan was so eager to tell me all about her decision to trust Christ as her personal Savior. How excited she was! She said she knew right away that God was calling her to respond and when she did, she knew God would be with her every day for the rest of her life. I told Joan to thank the Holy Spirit for leading her in that holy conversation. We praised God together for the new life she's found in our blessed Savior. Amazing grace!"



"When I arrived at the home, Maria was in pretty bad shape. She was rocking back and forth and said she was not doing well. I felt the darkness. I prayed in the Spirit with her, then, in Jesus name, declared healing in her mind and asked that He would surround us with the light of His glory and peace. I then read John 3 and Maria stopped rocking, stopped smoking and started to become calm and her mind started to be clear. She said she is tired of the darkness and feeling guilt and shame. She started praying and telling Jesus she did not want to live in this darkness any longer, she wanted to love Him and be forgiven by Him and to be His child. Tears flowed from her eyes. It was incredible to see the movement of God and the power in the name of Jesus to destroy the darkness."

"During the previous 4 months, our homeowner was a very serious, sad man in a lot of physical pain. On this workday, we were reading the Bible with him. One scripture took Larry by surprise. It was Romans 6:23 that states: 'the wages of sin is death.' Larry shared that he had read many scriptures before, but not that one and he was troubled by it. After explaining it to him and asking whether he would like forgiveness of his sins, he replied 'yes' and immediately prayed to accept Jesus into his life. In an instant a physical transformation took place. He was smiling from ear to ear. Immense joy flowed out of him and we were just as giddy as he was. Larry exclaimed, 'I am born again now, right? God loves me and Jesus loves me.' This was an absolutely Astonishing, God Inspired, Anointed, Glory filled day!"

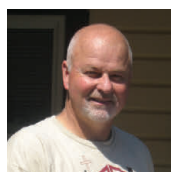
Volunteers

Good Works was blessed in 2021 with some great partners who did not let the year's challenges crush their spirit or dampen their enthusiasm to fulfill our essential mission. Two of those partners are highlighted in this year's annual report.

SS. Simon and Jude Parish



Saints Simon and Jude Parish located outside of West Chester, PA has been a Good Works Partner Church for almost 8 years. Annette Glaudel, who serves as the Good Works focal is also its Work Crew Leader. Annette, along with other members of the Parish have been serving with Appalachia Service Project (ASP) since 2003, but after learning about Good Works, members of her ASP team liked the idea of working one day a month locally. She and a few of others began volunteering in 2014 and within a year, they registered formally as a Partner Church. Ray Mazza is the team's technical advisor and together, they have completed eight homes and are starting a ninth in 2022. "I am blessed to have such a great group of people with which to work," Annette observed. Annette is a detail-oriented project manager and her organizational skills are appreciated by her dedicated team. She values partnership, and over the years the team has expanded to include volunteers from St. Agnes Parish and other churches in West Chester and more recently some high school seniors have joined in. "Home is such a special place," Annette shared, "You want it to be comfortable and I want to do that for people." Saints Simon and Jude members have been generous with more than their time. Financial contributions from the church have enabled Good Works to buy a skid loader and trailer which has been a game-changer for snow removal and other construction and landscaping tasks.

First Resource Bank



First Resource Bank has been an important partner of Good Works for several years. Glenn Marshall, Chief Executive Officer, has a passion for communities in the Delaware Valley. "Since our inception, we have leveraged our competitive deposit and lending capabilities in an effort to make our community stronger," Glenn shared. "I'm proud to say those efforts have paid off. Businesses were established, jobs were created, and more importantly, relationships were built." One of those relationships was with Good Works after being introduced to the ministry by a mutual friend. Good Works turned to First Resource Bank for a forgivable Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan in 2020 at the height of the COVID-19 crisis. Later that year, Glenn and his staff assisted Good Works with the acquisition of a lucrative Affordable Housing Program grant from the Federal Home Loan Bank in Pittsburgh. Valued at \$160,000, this provided critical repairs for 20 low-income families in 2021, most of whom are disabled and living in some of the poorest neighborhoods in Chester County. Community Focus is one of the values that sets First Resource apart and Good Works is blessed by Glenn and his team's generosity and support of our mission.

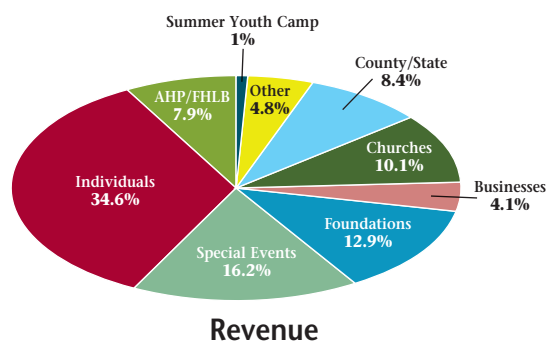

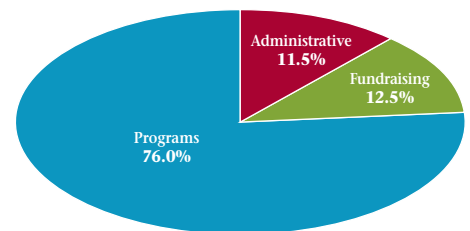
