WELCOME & PRAYER

Bob welcomed everyone and opened the meeting with prayer at 11:00 am. He introduced the theme of the meeting as "Resources", but not the resources we typically think of, such as human capital, or the physical supplies needed to run our businesses. This meeting focuses on the informational resources we rely on.

MYTH OF MULTITASKING

According to Forbes, multitasking is an inefficient and dangerous pursuit.

The Fast Company quotes Clifford Nass, a communication professor at Stanford. "...the more you multitask the less you're able to learn, concentrate, or be nice to people."

Contrary to popular belief, multitasking doesn't contribute to your success. It actually works against you.

- Background tasking can be efficient and helpful; things like listening to radio, podcasts or TV during our work or our learning.
- Switchtasking is often defined as multitasking, but it is juggling two or more tasks by refocusing attention back and forth. Productivity drops by up to 40% when we are switching between email and other tasks.





 Hypertasking is working on multiple tasks from multiple locations. Doing things on the run. Phone & driving, etc.

To make the point, Bob asked each member to draw 3 horizontal lines on a sheet of paper. He then directed everyone to write a series of words and numbers on two of the lines and to time themselves. Most completed the task in about 30 seconds. He then ask them to combine the first two lines of characters and numbers on the third line. This time the task took notably longer and resulted in mistakes proving that switchtasking reduces productivity and introduces errors. According to a series of prominent studies, we can lose up to 40% of our productivity when we switch between cognitive tasks vs. focusing on one task at a time. Multitasking also causes cognitive damage that may be permanent. The cognitive losses may even be greater than the losses that come from smoking marijuana.

The solution to this is monotasking, aka, single-tasking which involves focusing all of our mental resources and energy to one task. Bob challenged the group to try to focus on monotasking for one week.

- Practice "deep work"
- Get rid of distractions. Turn off notifications for email & messaging.
- Set intentions carefully.
- Schedule your day around peak performance times.
- Focus on what's important.

Rod Kubier: C12 for a year, chair and peers. Other contractors in similar industries but not so much competition.

Nick London: Microsoft Teams Task app helps prioritize main tasks.

Justin Harris: Franklin Covey seminar & Stephen Covey's book "Seven Habits of Highly Effective People."

Aaron Gregory: Migrated to Microsoft Teams about 2 years ago; a great resource/app for having everything in one place. Esp. their Calendar to do block time management.

Lee Wagner: Trello for project management. "Getting Things Done" book (free download) by David Allen. Look for Al tools to be an up & coming resource. ChatGPT. Architectural Design in ChatGPT, takes one picture and can change multiple styles. Snap an existing room pic and shoot back style changes. Collaboration with peers. Wise individual counsel.

Arlan Riehl: Go to lunch and/or breakfast often with a wide range of people. Breaking bread together does sooooo much for relationships. Books and talks by Patrick Lencioni, Simon Sinek & John Mark Comer.
