Founded in 1988, Good Works Inc. is a faith-based nonprofit organization headquartered in Coatesville, PA. From our warehouse sites in Coatesville, Exton, Phoenixville and St. Peters Village, we now serve 49 municipalities in Chester County. We transform substandard houses into warmer, safer, drier and healthier homes, and despair into hope. Our services are offered to homeowners at no cost and volunteers do most of the repairs. Our goal is to see the inhabitants of these homes rise above their level of poverty and experience a richness through being cared for and knowing that their circumstances matter to their community and to God. We believe that everyone benefits when people from different races, cultures and backgrounds join together with a common purpose – repairing homes and restoring hope.

FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



In their 2023 collaboration, popular Christian artists Katy Nichole and Big Daddy Weave proclaim in the chorus of “God Is in This Story”:

*God is in this story. God is in the details.
Even in the broken parts, He holds my heart.
He never fails. When I’m at my weakest,
I will trust in Jesus. Always in the highs and lows,
the One who goes before me—God is in this story.*

This past year, Good Works staff and volunteers made critical repairs to 195 homes across Chester County. Many of the homeowners who reached out for help were at their weakest—facing the very real possibility of having to leave the homes they loved. Whether due to storm damage, everyday wear and tear, or a simple lack of financial resources, a house in disrepair often leads to a life in disrepair.

Our mission—to transform lives by repairing homes for low-income families and sharing the hope found in Jesus Christ—is a practical, God-honoring response to the brokenness so many people face today.

There’s a beautiful metaphor in the ancient Japanese art of **Kintsugi**, where broken pottery is repaired using a lacquer mixed with powdered gold, silver, or platinum. The cracks, rather than being hidden, are highlighted—transformed into something more beautiful and valuable than before. The imperfections tell a story, and the restoration becomes a work of art.

This is the image I want you to hold in your heart when we speak of transforming lives. What was once broken has been lovingly restored—not hidden or discarded, but made whole in a way that reflects God’s glory and care.

As you read through our Annual Impact Report, know that there’s a story behind every homeowner, every volunteer, every achievement, every quote, every data point—and every dollar given and used with purpose. You are part of that story.

It’s a story that God set into motion long before Good Works was founded in 1988, and one that, by His grace, we trust will continue for many years to come. God is in this story!

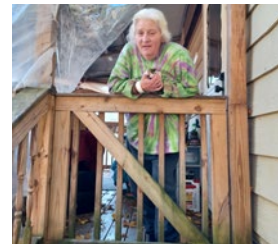
"All I need is a tarp on my roof," Cathy pleaded. "That's all I'm asking. I'm afraid my ceilings are going to collapse—and only 25% of my heart is working right now, so I can't fix it myself."

The urgency in her voice was unmistakable. At 61, Cathy had once been fiercely independent and fully capable of handling home repairs. But now, serious health issues had left her unable to manage even basic tasks. Moved by her situation, Bob Beggs offered to visit her home to expedite the necessary paperwork.



It was a cold, dark, rainy morning in February when Bob arrived — just as Cathy returned from a doctor's appointment. She was visibly shaken. She had just been told the lumps on her face were cancerous tumors requiring immediate surgery. Doctors warned her the operation was risky: there was a strong chance she could lose feeling in her face, and more gravely, her weakened heart might not survive the procedure. Standing together in the rain, the conversation shifted from roof repairs to something much deeper: Was Cathy ready to face this daunting diagnosis? They spoke for nearly 30 minutes and Bob promised to return the next day to pray with her.

When Bob returned, the weather had cleared. He shared the good news that Good Works had approved her application—temporary tarp repairs would begin immediately, and permanent roof work would soon follow. Cathy was grateful, but the looming six-hour emergency surgery weighed heavily on her



Every home transformed by Good Works carries a powerful story.

Each Good Works project begins with a comprehensive home inspection. Our aim is to uncover every needed repair—not just those initially requested by the homeowner. This approach serves as a metaphor for the work Christ does in our lives. When you open your home to Good Works, we strive to make it warm, safe, dry, and healthy. In the same way, when you open your heart to Jesus, He addresses every need—offering forgiveness, blessings in this life, and the promise of eternal life in the perfect home He has prepared for us (John 14:2). heart. Sitting at her kitchen table, she opened up about her fears and the uncertain future ahead. Bob gently asked, “If something were to happen in surgery, do you know where you would spend eternity?” Cathy replied, “I hope I’d go to heaven... but I’m not sure.”

Together, they opened a Bible and read scriptures of hope and assurance. Bob encouraged her, expressing his belief that the surgery would be successful and that God would heal not only her body but use her story to show His power and grace. There, at the table, Cathy recommitted her life to Jesus as they prayed together.

The following week, Cathy underwent surgery. Doctors removed nine tumors from her neck and face—and miraculously, none of the entangled nerves were damaged. The procedure went so well, even her doctors were amazed. In the weeks that followed, Cathy endured pain—but that pain was proof the nerves were healing. God had answered their prayers.

Later that summer, Cathy’s home was selected for a Good Works Work Camp. She didn’t just



receive a tarp—she received a brand new roof, new windows, and a team committed to making her home warm, safe, dry, and healthy. Work continued into 2025 to complete the needed repairs.

And the best part? Cathy chose to share her journey as part of the Good Works 2024 Ambassador Program video.

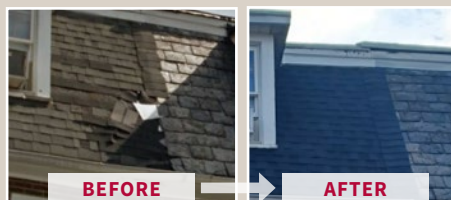
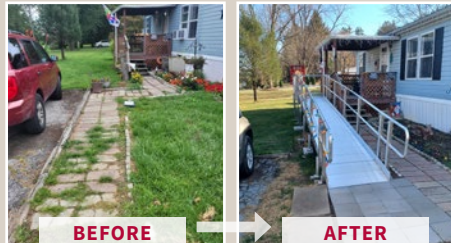

AMBASSADOR REFLECTIONS

James and Gina warmly welcomed me into their home, where I introduced myself as the Faith Ambassador for Good Works and offered to share the Bible and pray with them. During our conversation, they opened up about James's recent stroke and their efforts to understand why it happened, expressing frustration with reading the Bible due to its complexity. I read from the NIV version to make it clearer and shared the message of salvation. Gina, eager to learn despite being new to faith, joyfully accepted Jesus into her heart — a moment that filled the room with joy and gratitude.

I felt a spiritual struggle in following the Holy Spirit's leading, but God made it clear I needed to share the Gospel with Amy during our very first meeting. Though we'd never met and had limited time, Amy opened up about her struggles and deep need for prayer. The Spirit prompted me to show her that beyond prayer, she needed Jesus as her Savior, and as we read through the verses from Share Jesus Without Fear, she recognized her need for salvation. Amy joyfully accepted Christ, experienced a sense of peace, and although she had to leave

for work, she was eager to learn more — and I left filled with joy at seeing her set free and at peace with God.

While stopping at Wawa on the way to our last Workday visit, my fellow Ambassador complimented a young woman on her beauty, which opened the door for a deeper conversation. I asked about the cross pendant she wore and whether it reflected her faith, and she admitted she was unsure, sharing that her parents had differing views on religion. Ann shared her own faith story and presented the Gospel, which the young woman listened to closely. Though she didn't make a decision for Christ in that moment, she felt the encounter was "meant to be," and we trust that a meaningful seed was planted — glory to God!

When I visited Henri's home, his granddaughter Rae greeted me and shared that Henri was asleep, so we sat on the porch together. Rae mentioned she was dealing with stomach issues, so I prayed for her healing and then offered to share a devotional titled "Waiting Expectantly," based on Psalm 27:14. As we discussed the idea of waiting, especially in light of her upcoming doctor's appointment, I encouraged her to be brave and courageous while trusting God. She appreciated the encouragement, agreed with the message, and we ended with a personal prayer—she warmly welcomed a future visit and I promised to keep her in my prayers.

During a visit to Sandy's home, we learned she was recovering in a healthcare facility after a fall. Her daughter expressed concern that, despite Sandy's religious background, she might not fully understand the Gospel. Since





then, we've made it a point to visit Sandy regularly, sharing the Gospel, reading Bible verses, and offering prayers. These visits have also opened doors to minister to the facility's staff and other residents, including the father of a previous homeowner, with family members often joining our conversations. All glory to God for these opportunities!

During my visit to Amos and Cherry's home, I was warmly welcomed, and we quickly found common ground in our conversation. As we spoke, Cherry shared her past experiences with the church, revealing feelings of rejection due to Amos's previous divorce. Despite her adherence to religious practices in her youth, she felt excluded and questioned her standing with God. I reassured her with the comforting truth from Hebrews 13:5 that God promises never to leave or forsake us. Later, I shared a devotional based on Isaiah 55:8-9, which emphasizes the vast difference between God's thoughts and ways and our own. Amos resonated deeply with this message, reflecting on the transient nature of life and the importance of living each day with gratitude and trust in God's sovereignty. We concluded our time together with a heartfelt prayer, and I look forward to returning to continue our fellowship.

AFFILIATE AMBASSADOR REFLECTIONS

Thanks to our interaction with the Good Works Ambassador program we are more intentional with our time with our homeowners and volunteers during our workdays. Additionally, we are partnering with local churches to follow up with our homeowners for ongoing support and spiritual growth. We believe the adjustments we have made are helping us yield more Kingdom impact.

Good Works has been a true blessing to our organization, helping accelerate the work we do with a Christ-centered motive. While our program has faced limitations in fully implementing the Ambassador Program, we have remained intentional in weaving the Word of God into our work—living out the Gospel through character, service, and love.

Though our approach may look different, we believe we are carrying out the heart of the Ambassador Program in a way that is unique and meaningful to our community. Personally, I have benefited deeply from the monthly lessons, which are always timely, practical, and rooted in Scripture. They have strengthened my leadership and deepened the spiritual foundation of our work. I am grateful for the ongoing encouragement, support, and example Good Works provides.

Stories of Teamwork

GOOD WORKS is blessed with many great church and corporate partners. This year we are highlighting Old South Union Church in recognition of their 10 years of dedicated service for a community 350 miles from their home in Weymouth, MA.

REACHING BEYOND WEYMOUTH: Old South Union Church's Mission in Pennsylvania

The Town of Weymouth, Massachusetts, founded in 1622 as the Wessagusset Colony, is the second oldest township in the state. Renamed in 1635 and incorporated into the Massachusetts Bay Colony, it grew steadily as a fishing and agricultural community. In 1723—more than 50 years before the signing of the Declaration of Independence—Old South Union Church was founded. Now, over three centuries later, the church remains a vibrant force in the community and beyond.

Senior Pastor Jennie Barrett Siegal recalls how Old South Union Church discovered its mission field nearly 350 miles away. “We found Good Works through a Google search—though clearly the Holy Spirit had a hand in it,” she said.

“We were looking for a mission partner that could offer projects suited to our intergenerational team, many of whom are skilled tradespeople. Good Works in Chester County, Pennsylvania, turned out to be a perfect fit.”

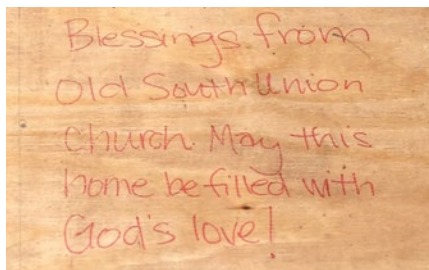
Unlike many organizations focused solely on youth groups, Good Works welcomed Old South Union's mix of adults and young people. “We're able to use the unique gifts of our volunteers while partnering with a group that shares our faith and values,” Siegal said. “The connections we've made—with both Good Works staff and the homeowners—keep us coming back year after year.”

Each summer, church members travel to Pennsylvania for a week-long mission trip, combining physical service with spiritual renewal. Days begin in prayer and end with evening devotions, reflection, and worship. “Getting away from daily routines helps us tune in to how God is moving in our lives,” said Siegal.

She shared a favorite memory from one such trip: “One of our teams was re-roofing a house. When I visited, they convinced me to climb up which was no small feat! They asked me to write a blessing on the plywood before the shingles went on. We prayed together for the homeowner. It was a beautiful moment where faith and service truly came together.”

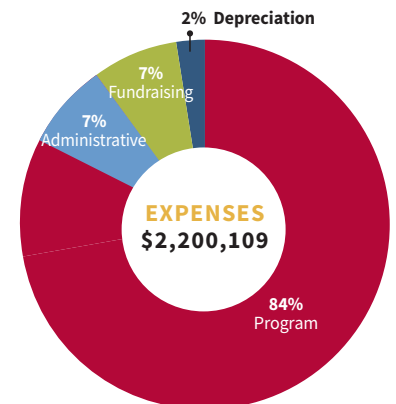
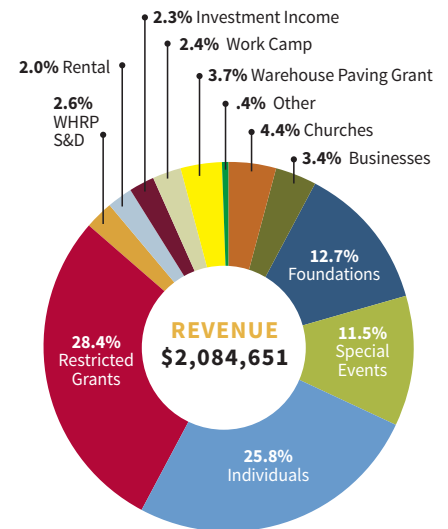
