From the Executive Director

A tool is an object that extends an individual's ability to modify features of the surrounding environment or accomplish a particular task. Likewise, a trade is a skilled job, typically requiring manual skills and special training. For instance, carpenters who are skilled tradespeople utilize hammers, rulers, and saws to craft with wood, while electricians employ tools such as multimeters, wire strippers, and screwdrivers.



At Good Works, staff and volunteers utilize a myriad of tools during workdays to complete physical repairs on homes. However, there is another dimension to the word "trade." A trade can also refer to the action of exchanging something for something else. This type of trade unfolds as work on the home progresses and relationships develop between volunteers and the residents being served. Strangers become friends, doubt gives way to trust, and despair is eclipsed by hope. The tools of this form of trade are the hours committed by volunteers, the conversations that unfold during the work, and the prayers lifted up on each other's behalf. These trades can be transformational for all involved, whether homeowner or volunteer, as God, though unchanging, constantly works to transform us.

Consider this: God was the architect of the greatest trade in human history. His creation faced a self-inflicted problem called sin, and God's penalty for sin is death. Since God never intended for people to die, He sent His son Jesus on a mission of epic proportion-to save the world. How could a Jewish carpenter achieve such a feat? Jesus wasn't a typical tradesman; He was none other than the Son of the Almighty. At the will of His Father, He traded His wood-working tools for a crown of thorns, a wooden cross, a hammer, and three nails. Jesus was ultimately born for one reason: to become the final and complete sacrifice for our sins. When He shed His blood and died on that cross, all our sins were transferred to Him, and with that, God's wrath was satisfied. The theological term for this is Substitutionary Atonement, but for us regular folk, it is simply the greatest act of love ever bestowed on the world. The cross, a tool man intended for torture and shame, was miraculously transformed into the tool God used for good—His death for our life. It was the ultimate tool of the ultimate trade.

As you read our Annual Impact Report, I hope you will appreciate how God continues to equip and use ordinary people as His tools to accomplish extraordinary things, and that you will be inspired by the results.

A Birthday to Remember

When the tree crashed down on Sandy's mobile home the day after New Year's, it not only crushed her roof but also her spirit. Already mourning the passing of her brother during the holidays, another disaster was the last thing she needed. Sandy recalls the winter wind buffeting her mobile home when she heard a loud crack followed by the sickening sound of broken metal, wood, and glass. Her garden shed absorbed some of the impact, but not enough to prevent the tree limbs from piercing her roof, crushing the rafters, and shattering the window of her bedroom. "I could see the sky through my ceiling, and the



branches were in my bed." Had she been in the bedroom at the time, the outcome could have been far more tragic. When municipal Emergency Services arrived, it was evident that Sandy could not remain in her home. At 76 years old, the last thing she needed to hear was that her home was now "unfit for human occupancy."

Fortunately, Sandy's caregiver, Brianna, came to her rescue and helped her seek assistance from the Red Cross and the Chester County Department of Community Development. They arranged for her to stay in a local hotel, but Sandy had no idea if or when she would ever be able to return home or see her beloved pet cats again. As it happened, Brianna had assisted Sandy in applying to Good Works a year prior, and some preparatory work had commenced on her home the previous August. When Good Works received a call from Emergency Services on January 10th, alerting them to the situation, it was clear urgent action was needed. Repair Supervisor Joe Lisowski inspected the scene and collaborated with municipal authorities. His staff and volunteer teams promptly began the task of removing the tree from atop the home, rebuilding the rafters, installing a new metal roof, and adding insulation, fresh drywall, and new laminate flooring. They also upgraded the electrical panel and completed other necessary repairs to ensure the home was safe for Sandy's return.

Sandy's 77th birthday fell on a Monday in the last week of February. Brianna visited her at the hotel, bringing balloons, small gifts, and wonderful news. Sandy's home had just passed its technical and occupancy inspection that day, and she would be moving back home that very week. On Thursday, February 29th, Sandy returned home, greeted by her cats, Brianna, and members of the Good Works staff. Sandy was overjoyed to witness firsthand all the repairs that had enabled her to reclaim her home. The expression on Sandy's face was priceless as she stepped into her renovated bedroom. "It's beautiful," she exclaimed as she admired the new window that had previously been shattered by the tree. Everyone shared some "Happy Birthday and Welcome Home, Sandy" cake to celebrate the joyous occasion. Over the next few weeks, Good Works completed several other significant upgrades to Sandy's home, including renovating her bathroom to install a walk-in shower and other accommodations to improve accessibility and safety. Sandy's extensive home repairs were funded by the Chester County Whole Home Repairs Program.





Abundance from **Scarcity**

Our God Exceeds Expectations

In January, as we embarked on planning the 2023/2024 annual budget, the financial forecast appeared bleak. The postpandemic inflated costs for building materials and services had escalated the average cost of completing a home to \$15,000. Additionally, an Affordable Housing Program grant from the

Federal Home Loan Bank had not been received due to modifications in their award criteria. The Good Works Board of Directors and senior staff acknowledged that without identifying a new source of funding, we would be compelled to significantly reduce the number of families we could assist in 2023 and potentially cancel some volunteer workdays by year-end. Good Works was in need of a miracle. So, we prayed, and it came—not once, but twice!

Whole Home Repairs Program

The Whole Home Repairs Program (WHRP) was established to assist homeowners in making crucial home improvements aimed at ensuring safety, habitability, energy efficiency, and accessibility for individuals with disabilities. Funded by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, the program was launched in early 2023 as a competitive grant initiative by the Chester County Department of Community Development. Its criteria included addressing home repairs countywide and serving residents with incomes up to 80% of the Area Median Income, Despite these stringent requirements, a collaborative effort between Good Works, Good Neighbors, and Habitat for Humanity emerged to fulfill all the prerequisites and offer the county an optimal solution. Both the Proposal Review Team and the Chester County Commissioners unanimously approved the proposal, leading to the WHRP Coalition being awarded a three-year contract in October 2023 to repair over 170 homes. This landmark collaboration between Good Works, Good Neighbors, and Habitat for Humanity marks the beginning of what seems to be a fruitful partnership, with plans for another round of WHRP funding pending in Harrisburg.










Federal Home Loan Bank Affordable Housing Program

Good Works received its first Federal Home Loan Bank Affordable Housing Program (AHP) grant in 2020, enabling us to repair 20 homes during 2021 and 2022. The program is highly competitive and requires a partnership with a local FHLBank, which in our case is First Resource Bank of Exton. After successfully executing the first grant, we were hopeful for a second grant in 2023. However, due to a change in the FHLB scoring criteria, Good Works did not receive an award, which was disappointing. Following a meeting with bank officials in January 2023, we learned that the revised criteria was being re-evaluated for 2024, prompting us to submit another proposal. In December 2023, we gratefully received news that out of 116 competitive applications received, Good Works was one of the 40 selected for an award.



In early 2023, our humble and earnest prayers were for the ability to continue operating throughout the year. God's response not only enabled that, but provided financial resources that extend through the next three years. He exceeded our expectations, fulfilling the scripture that says: "Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us, to Him be glory..." (Ephesians 3:20-21). To God be the glory indeed!
