#### **DEVOTION – Is Your Jesus Too Small?** (See Enclosure 1)

At Christmas, many people picture a gentle baby in a manger—quiet, harmless, and easy to admire—but that image alone is incomplete. Scripture reveals that Jesus did not begin in Bethlehem; He is the eternal Word through whom all things were created, the Creator who took on human flesh. He lived in perfect love and truth, defeated death through His resurrection, reigns with all authority, and will one day return as King and Judge. His birth was not small or sentimental but a decisive moment in a cosmic battle, declaring war on darkness and releasing redeeming love into the world. This matters deeply for those who serve and restore what is broken, because a diminished view of Jesus produces diminished faith, while the risen and reigning Christ sees, honors, and works alongside those whose ordinary acts of love carry eternal weight. This Christmas, we remember that Jesus is not only the baby in the manger but the eternal King to whom all allegiance belongs.

- 1. Do you ever make Jesus small? What are some examples of how we do that? Responses: Everyday pressures distract us. The belief that I have the wisdom and knowledge to do things myself.
- 2. How can you expand your small faith to live out what God has called you to do? Responses: Putting God first. Sharing trials and issues with other Christians. Practice Romans 12:2.
- 3. Homework Assignment: Read Revelation 12:1-17. How does that account of Christmas change your perspective?

Enclosure 1: December 2025 Is Your Jesus Too Small? Isaiah 9:6

"For unto us a Child is born, Unto us a Son is given; And the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

When someone mentions Christmas, what's the first thing that comes to mind? Frosted windowpanes? Candles glowing? Candy canes on the tree? Santa in his sleigh? And, of course, the baby Jesus. The baby Jesus stands at the center of every nativity scene and appears on countless Christmas cards. He is gentle, quiet, and harmless. That's the Jesus many people are comfortable with...a Jesus who asks little of us beyond a moment of admiration once or twice a year.

But that picture, while true, is incomplete. Jesus did not begin His existence in a manger. The Gospel of John takes us back before Bethlehem, back before time itself: "In the beginning the Word already existed. The Word was with God, and the Word was God. He existed in the beginning with God. God created everything through him." (John 1:1–3) John uses the word Logos (translated as the Word) meaning the ordering force, the very soul of the universe. And John makes a bold claim: this Logos is not impersonal. He is a person. And that person is Jesus Christ, the One who "became flesh and dwelt among us." The baby in the manger was in fact, the Creator of all things, wrapped in human skin.

Jesus lived a life marked by perfect love and truth. He healed the broken and welcomed the forgotten. He was unjustly and brutally killed. But death did not win. Jesus rose from the grave, ascended into heaven, and took His rightful place at the right hand of God, declaring, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me." (Matthew 28:18) And one day, this same Jesus will return, not as a helpless infant, but as King and Judge. He is the Alpha and the Omega. The beginning and the end.

So, what really happened that first Christmas in Bethlehem? It wasn't small and it wasn't silent. Behind the scenes, Scripture tells us that a spiritual battle shook heaven and earth. The birth of Jesus was a direct threat to the powers of darkness. Christmas was not just a sweet moment...it was war declared and love unleashed. (Revelation 12:1-17)

Why does this matter to those who serve, build, repair, and restore homes for others? Because a small Jesus leads to small faith. And small faith struggles to sustain big obedience and alignment with our true purpose. But the real Jesus...the risen, reigning King sees your work. He honors what feels unseen. And He gives eternal weight to ordinary acts done in love. Remember that the same hands that shaped the universe once held tools bore calluses and ultimately the nails that pinned Him to the cross on our behalf. Jesus understands the work of restoring what is broken. When you serve, you do not serve alone—you serve with Him.

This Christmas, let's keep our perspective clear. Jesus is the eternal King from whom all blessings flow and to whom all allegiance is due. Merry Christmas!
